1 Name of Rule

This Rule is the *Legal Profession Uniform Admission Amendment (Fame and Character) Rule 2019*.

2 Commencement

This Rule commences on the day on which it is published on the NSW legislation website.

3 Authorising provision

This Rule is made by the Legal Services Council under Part 9.2 of the *Legal Profession Uniform Law*.

Schedule 1 Amendment of Legal Profession Uniform Admission Rules 2015

[1] Rule 10 Determining whether someone is a fit and proper person

Omit rule 10(1)(f). Insert instead—

- (f) whether the person has demonstrated satisfactorily the ethical and professional standards appropriate for an Australian lawyer,

[2] Rule 10(1)(m)

Insert after rule 10(1)(l)—

- (m) whether the person’s admission in this jurisdiction would undermine public confidence in the integrity and honesty of the legal profession.

[3] Rule 14 Application for readmission

Omit rule 14(1)(c). Insert instead—

- (c) events that tend to establish that the applicant’s readmission would not undermine public confidence in the integrity and honesty of the legal profession,
- (c1) events since the applicant’s name was removed from that roll that tend to establish that the applicant has demonstrated satisfactorily the ethical and professional standards appropriate for an Australian lawyer,

[4] Rule 16 Evidence of character

Omit “fame and” from rule 16(6).

[5] Rule 17 Disclosure statement

Omit “of good fame and character and” from rule 17(1).

[6] Rule 17(7)

Omit “and always have been of good fame and character”.

Insert instead “a fit and proper person to be admitted to the Australian legal profession”.
